### Honorable Honorable Erica Adeyemi

The Honorable Erica Adeyemi is a trailblazer, as one of the youngest members of any state's legislative body and one of the first orphans to hold political office. She is a versatile young leader serving in many capacities as author, speaker, mentor, philanthropist, political consultant, media personality, nationally renowned foster care advocate, Brand Ambassador and Georgia State Representative, representing Georgia's 39th house district in Cobb County.

Rep. Thomas has taken a demanding global approach to the economic and environmental development of the world. As an innovative trailblazer and entrepreneur with a passion for inspiring others, she is the founder of Speak Out Loud, a nonprofit which focuses on public speaking, leadership development, training and advocacy. Speak Out Loud is dedicated to giving a voice to foster children who have been silenced by their circumstances and has expanded and organized across the country with chapters in Botswana and Nigeria. In 2013, Rep. Thomas was awarded the Ambassador for Peace Award from the Global Peace Foundation and has worked to establish libraries in various locations on the continent of Africa.



Dr. Elizabeth Wynter

Dr. Elizabeth Wynter, an award-winning advocate, has dedicated over two decades to transforming child welfare policies and practices, tirelessly advocating for change. Her pioneering initiatives, notably National Foster Youth Voice Month and her Foster Youth Voice Champion Blog, challenge stereotypes by reshaping perceptions of youth from passive service recipients to essential organizational assets. In Wynter's influential book, "Follow the Love: Permanent Connections Scaffolding," she charts a path for agencies to embrace youth voices and establish lasting connections.

Receiving her Bachelor's in Merchandising from Florida State University, Master's in Mental Health Counseling, and Doctorate in Organizational Leadership from Nova Southeastern University with a dissertation on transitioning youth was more than an academic achievement for Dr. Wynter; it symbolized a journey of self-discovery and dedication to empowering others.

Dr. Wynter stands as a force of nature—a visionary leader with an untamed heart. Her relentless advocacy and dedication to a cause greater than herself continue to inspire change-makers. Dr. Wynter's work is a testament to the power of collective impact for youth transitioning, and her unwavering commitment serves as a beacon of hope for vulnerable young individuals, reshaping the world for the better.

# Connecting the Dots between Substance Abuse and Human Trafficking

Substance use is one of the most influential techniques that human traffickers use to coerce, manipulate, and exploit their victims. Substances is commonly used to prey on the persons vulnerabilities that leads to the recruitment of labor and sex trafficking. The trafficker may recruit people by luring them with drugs and alcohol. The traffickers may target individuals with existing substance abuse issues to recruit into a trafficking situation. The trafficker may also control their victim once they have a Substance Addiction. The Traffickers may also use substance addiction to keep victims in a trafficking situation. It can be framed as a reward or punishment, or to decrease the victim's ability to resist trafficking and abuse. The victim may also use substance abuse as a coping mechanism.
